A great way to help Christian Aid

Faith Will...move mountains! Faith Will...bear fruit! Faith Will...live on!

Our faith is powerful. So are gifts in Wills. This is why Christian Aid is partnering with *seven* Christian denominations to encourage people to remember their church community, and Christian Aid, in their Will.

<u>Faith Will</u> is an award-winning initiative, launched in 2023. Initially it involved the Church of Scotland, Church of England and the Quakers. Last year, they were joined by the United Reformed Church and for 2025, there are three new Welsh partners – The Church in Wales, The Presbyterian Church of Wales and the Union of Welsh Independents.

The campaign is the first of its kind – an ecumenical way of approaching Legacy giving. This joint initiative is designed to start conversations in churches about leaving gifts in Wills and the powerful change that can create both at home and further away. We know it can be difficult to know where and how to begin, so there are free resources available to make it easier for churches to get started. You can even book a trained speaker to come and talk about it!

Gifts in Wills help tackle global poverty and injustice and also create lasting change in local communities.

Churches are at the heart of our communities, and for many, they're a spiritual home. Every gift to a local church strengthens communities, and shares God's love with future generations.

By helping congregations to consider leaving a gift in their Will to their own church and Christian Aid, we are demonstrating a way our faith can live on, helping our local community to flourish while tackling injustice and poverty worldwide. What a legacy!

The partners are encouraging churches to consider introducing this at a convenient point in the year for the church and providing everything needed to make that happen. The range of free resources include a worship pack with sermon ideas, service outlines, prayers and activities, and there are also leaflets available for each congregation. The three minute film is excellent if there is a shorter time available - or as part of a longer conversation.

The Christian Aid Legacy team, as well as the local regional Christian Aid contact, are on hand to help if you would like some more ideas and inspiration for an event.
