Meditation is easy to learn and has proven benefits in improving health and emotional well-being.



Dear Supporters

At the Food Co-op this week, 70 families/couples and 40 single persons from our local community attended for food, toiletries and random household items (167 adults and 137 children). Another very

steady session with some queuing from before 8.00am.

Donations were received from several local churches, a Food Waste Champion and individual supporters. This week we were the grateful recipient of a Harvest donation from Sheriff Hill Methodist Church, an amazing donation of apples from a friend of a friend in Durham and an unexpected donation from an ex-member. The family was supported for many years including through COVID. The father is now a taxi driver and called in on Monday with a very generous donation of all items he had found useful — nappies, pasta, lentils, oil and more. Although we never expect donations it is most encouraging when we receive them.

Despite all the negative press, all volunteers who were able, attended today. Conversations were had about the social media and press coverage of the recent weeks, and it was disappointing to hear of the impact this is having on their children. All volunteers feel in a most privileged position. The Food Co-op enables us to get to know each other and work together as a team where we all are comfortable enough to share concerns.
