A busy session at the Food Co-op today with 105 people coming to choose food, toiletries and household items. The 105 represented 66 families/couples and 39 single persons (152 adults and 110 children). Donations of food were gratefully received from several churches, a primary school, a food waste champion and individual supporters. Everyone left with an assortment of fresh, dried and tinned items.

Before the session starts, the volunteers spend time socialising, exchanging news and having refreshments. Once we are open, there's limited time to chat as the members occupy the time. Today we spent time, prior to opening, celebrating 3 birthdays and the birth of a baby girl. A volunteer's wife gave birth last Thursday. Despite the wide range of languages spoken and the disparate backgrounds of the volunteers, they are unified by their aim of assisting others. This creates a welcoming and friendly atmosphere for all comers.

Once again, thank you for all your donations, without which we would be unable to operate the Food Co-op in the local community.
