

Dear Supporters

Today was our last session of 2025 at the Food Co-op. One hundred and fifty-seven people came through the door, representing 99 families/ couples and 58 single people (242)

adults and 174 children). As you can imagine it was a very busy session, but we were well supported by all the volunteers. This morning, 27 volunteers from many countries assisted - Sudan (5), Congo (2), Albania(1), Nigeria (1), Honduras (1), Afghanistan (2), Eritrea (2), Ethiopia (1), Kurdistan (1), Turkey (2), El Salvador (2), Palestine (1), Namibia (1) and the UK (5). Several of the volunteers, who are working, arranged to have the time off ensuring we had plenty of help.

Donations were received from several local churches, a primary school, individual supporters and Cardinal Hume School. Through Faith in Action the young people collected toiletries and delivered them to Corpus Christi Church. With the Food Coop volunteers, they helped with sorting them into packs and also willingly helped with other tasks that needed completing before the end of the year. It was a pleasure to meet them and hope it helped them gain an understanding of the Food Co-op.

We received an unexpected donation of Christmas items that had been surplus to the Christmas Fayre at St Chads. Items were put into small gift bags and distributed today, proving very popular.

Many thanks to all who donated to the appeals for items for the Christmas Bags. Thanks also to all who put the bags together and delivered them to Corpus Christi Church. All members were very thrilled to receive a bag of treats today. Despite the numbers, no one left empty handed. There were even enough selection boxes to pass on to all children in the families, which was amazing. On Monday, all volunteers were overwhelmed with the generosity and kindness of our local community as donations came through the doors. Thank you to all for your steadfast commitment to our community.

Please note: We will reopen on Monday 12th January for donations and Tuesday 13th January for our first session of 2026.
